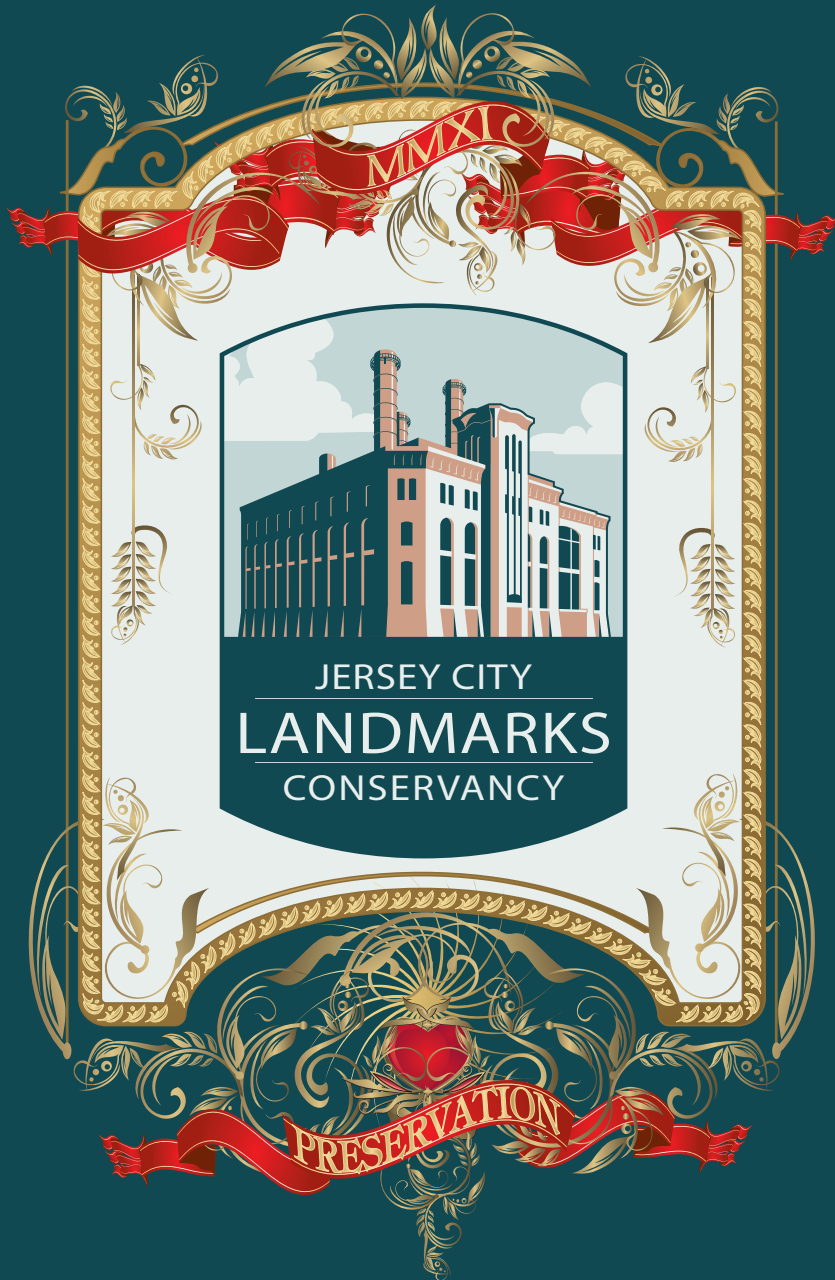

ANNOUNCING OUR 2011 PRESERVATION AWARDEES

EXCELLENCE IN PRESERVATION AWARDS

- To the County of Hudson for the exterior restoration of the Justice William J. Brennan Jr. Courthouse, located at 583 Newark Avenue in Jersey City. The American Renaissance-era structure was erected between 1906-1910 and was designed by architect Hugh Roberts. The courthouse is listed on the National Register of Historic Places.
- To Carol Losos and Judson Weaver, owners, and Armstrong + Cohen Architecture for the outstanding restoration of, and creative addition to, the circa-1860 Gothic Revival mansion located at 240 Ogden Avenue in the Heights section of Jersey City.

PRESERVATION INITIATIVE AWARDS

- To the Roman Catholic Archdiocese of Newark for the salvage, restoration, and relocation of the 19th-century stained glass windows taken from the decommissioned Saint Boniface Church in downtown Jersey City and installed in the newly-constructed Holy Name Mausoleum at 823 West Side Avenue in Jersey City.
- To developer Seth Yaroni and architect Ronald J. Russell of LWDNR and Associates for Washington Pointe, an 8-story residential tower located at 253 Washington Street in the Paulus Hook Historic District. The builders created a sensitive Postmodern infill design that compliments and transitions into surrounding historicist architecture.

J. OWEN GRUNDY HISTORY AWARD

- To James T. Fisher, Ph.D, author of *On the Irish Waterfront: The Crusader, the Movie, and the Soul of the Port of New York*, a compelling history of the New York City/Hudson County waterfront, detailing the rise of Irish-American entrepreneurs, union leaders and Jersey City political bosses Frank Hague and John V. Kenny.

THEODORE CONRAD PRESERVATIONIST AWARD

- To the Washington Park Association for organizing to preserve the distinct landscape architecture of Washington Park, a century-old Hudson County park located at the Jersey City/Union City border and designed by renowned landscape architect Charles Lowrie.

JERSEY CITY LEGEND AWARD

- To Dr. Jonathan C. Gibbs, M.D. for his lifetime of distinguished service and dedication to the Jersey City community. Dr. Gibbs served as the first African-American Chief of Surgery at the Jersey City Medical Center.

Tickets are \$25 at the lobby door and include a slide presentation, open buffet dinner, coffee and dessert, live music by the Larry Banks Jazz Ensemble, and a private tour of the theatre.
